
Webmail – SquirrelMail Installation SA-E Track @ AfNOG 2009

Install PHP Version 5

SquirrelMail is written in PHP. You, also, need to install PHP support for Apache. To do this we do:

```
# portinstall php5
```

You will see a screen that looks like this:



Select **APACHE** and then select **OK** and press enter to continue.

When the php5 installation completes do the following:

```
# cd /usr/local/etc/apache22
# vi httpd.conf
```

Look for a section that reads:

```
<IfModule dir_module>
    DirectoryIndex index.html
</IfModule>
```

and insert the following text right after that line: (watch out for case)

```
<IfModule php5_module>
AddType application/x-httpd-php .php
AddType application/x-httpd-php-source .phps
DirectoryIndex index.html index.htm index.php
</IfModule>
```

Next, let's edit our php configuration

```
# cd /usr/local/etc
```

```
# cp php.ini-recommended php.ini
# chmod 644 php.ini
# vi php.ini
```

Change the line that reads:

```
; Initialize session on request startup.
session.auto_start = 0
To:
```

```
; Initialize session on request startup.
session.auto_start = 1
```

Now save and exit the file (:wq).

To finish, we need to restart Apache so that the php5 module is loaded.

```
# apachectl restart
```

Install the Dovecot IMAP/POP server

This will be used by SquirrelMail to act as an IMAP/POP server on your machine.

```
# portinstall dovecot
```

You will be asked two questions:

```
Install 'mail/dovecot-devel'? [yes] no
Install 'mail/dovecot'? [yes] yes
```

Once dovecot finishes installing we need to enable it and start the service:

```
# vi /etc/rc.conf
```

Add a line to the bottom of the file and add:

```
dovecot enable="YES"
```

Copy over a configuration file that works for our purposes:

```
# cd /usr/local/etc
# scp inst@noc.sae.ws.afnog.org:configs/dovecot.conf .
# /usr/local/etc/rc.d/dovecot start
```


You will get an INFO message on the screen. You can ignore this.

<u>Install SquirrelMail</u>

```
# portinstall squirrelmail
```

You will be presented with three different configuration screens during installation:

The choices are fine in this screen, so select **OK** to continue.



This is already selected and this is fine. Select **OK** and continue.



Select the BUNDLED_PCRE option, then OK to continue.



Once SquirrelMail finishes installing you need to configure Apache a bit more by setting up a virtualhost for your mail.

We will edit the httpd-vhosts.conf file to do this:

```
# cd /usr/local/etc/apache22/extra
# vi httpd-vhosts.conf
```

At the end of the file add the following virtualhost container. (Remember to change the "pcX" entries for your host):

```
<VirtualHost *:80>
    ServerAdmin inst@pcX.sae.ws.afnog.org
    DocumentRoot /usr/local/www/squirrelmail
    ServerName mail.pcX.sae.ws.afnog.org
    ErrorLog /var/log/mail-error_log
    CustomLog /var/log/mail-access_log common
</VirtualHost>
```

In addition, we must update the main httpd.conf file to give proper permissions to the SquirrelMail install directory:

```
# cd .. (you should be in /usr/local/etc/apache22)
# vi httpd.conf
```

Find the **end** of the entry that starts with:

```
<Directory "/usr/local/www/share">
```

and ends with:

```
</Directory>
```

At this point in the file add the following:

```
<Directory "/usr/local/www/squirrelmail">
    Options Indexes FollowSymLinks
    AllowOverride None
    Order allow,deny
    Allow from all
</Directory>
```

Now we stop and start Apache to pick up all our changes.

```
# apachectl stop
# apachectl start
```

Final Configuration

At the end of the SquirrelMail installation there was a message on the screen about configuring the application. To do this you would do the next two commands. However, please note that the default configuration is good enough to see our initial SquirrelMail screens, but may not work to actually send email at this point:

```
# cd /usr/local/www/squirrelmail/
```

./configure

Command >>

Here is what the initial SquirrelMail configuration menu looks like:

```
SquirrelMail Configuration : Read: config_default.php (1.4.0)

You might consider going to the Server Settings option and changing the domain name from example.com to pcX.sae.ws.afnog.org.

SquirrelMail should now work. You can test this by opening your web browser to the following URL:

http://mail.pcX.sae.ws.afnog.org/

and you should see SquirrelMail up ad running on your host. You can log in to SquirrelMail as the user *inst* and see what it looks like.
